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JUDGE'S COPY OF SCENARIO TEAM SCENARIO

While attending events at the Ontario Science Center you hear a yell and the sound of breaking glass. Upon investigating you find a lab technician lying on the floor conscious but bleeding. It appears to you that the person was carrying two bottles from a laboratory to a display.

N.B.

There will be an announcement of time at the 5 minute, and final 2 minutes points of the scenario.

Good luck! You have 15 minutes to complete the scenario.

Note to Judges: If any First Aiders come in contact with the simulated chemicals, they are to be notified of the situation, and told to treat the possible exposure correctly, (supplies used on the First Aider cannot be counted for the casualty as well i.e. water.)

INJURIES

- Casualty suffering from Diabetic Coma - (Acetone breath).
- Broken glass in right hand
- Broken glass in face.
- Chemical burns on hands and lower arms (up to the elbows) from acid.

CASUALTY PROMPTS

- Casualty is lying down and attempting to get up.
- Simulated acid on the floor at the end of the square, competitor should try to move casualty away from the simulated acid.
- Conscious but confused throughout the scenario
- Casualty is a diabetic but can't remember if they took insulin.
- Pain in right hand (from glass incision, reacts loudly to pain).
- Pain in face - wondering if they hurt their face.
- Casualty frequently asks for a drink – they are thirsty.

PROPS

- Band-aid soaked with nail polish remover (acetone) stuck under collar of tyvecs (to provide the acetone smell of breath).
- Simulated acid on hands – up to their elbows. – that would have to be cleaned off.
- Plastic cup stepped on to flatten with label facing up.
- Wearing Tyvec coveralls.
- Bottle with WHMIS Label for chemical
