Who is first in First Aid?

Over 500 participants and guests converged on Humber College in Toronto May 18-20 as part of the National Brigade Patient Care Competitions 2001. Skilled volunteers in twenty teams, representing eight provinces demonstrated their patient care and general teamwork skills.

Teams competed in three separate areas:

- Junior team members (less than 16 years of age) utilized the full scope of the Cadet program with first aid portions at Emergency First Aid Level;
- Senior team members demonstrated knowledge and skills at Level 1 of the Brigade Training System; and
- Open team members met challenges requiring the knowledge and skills of BTS Level 3.

Organized by a dedicated committee over a three-year period, the event saw over 250 volunteers working together – the simulators created realistic scenarios to challenge the competitors, while teams responded accordingly utilizing their teamwork, initiative, problem solving ability and competency in patient care.
